## **A Season of Gathering**



Our vision is that Outdoor School is a place where every child can belong. This is an aspirational vision, and members of the Outdoor School profession are continuously improving their craft in order to ensure students have amazing learning experiences. Thanks to your support, Friends of Outdoor School has provided leadership for the recent success of two conferences: the Oregon Outdoor School Gathering and the Residential Outdoor Environmental Education Conference

The Oregon Outdoor School Gathering is the second-ever in-person conference for Oregon Outdoor School. Nearly 200 people gathered at the Oregon 4-H Center for three days of learning at the end of January. Outdoor School professionals have always held a culture of continuous improvement, and they had ample opportunity to gain knowledge and skills to:

- Deepen our commitment to equity work in outdoor education
- Cultivate relationships and build community with other Outdoor School educators, programs, sites, and partners
- Engage in professional learning around best business management practices, curriculum and instruction, high school leadership programs, culturally responsive outdoor education, and more

From tools to make Outdoor School more accessible to helping youth at Outdoor School gain employability skills to creative wildfire curriculum, the gathering inspired the Outdoor School community to take an already amazing program and make it even better for kids.



For many years, Friends of Outdoor School has supported the Residential Outdoor Environmental Education (ROEE)



Conference. In February, Sophia attended ROEE at the Mt. Rainier Institute in Washington. This conference is an opportunity for educators from across the country to gather and share about successes, struggles, and celebrate the way that environmental education is moving forward.

This year was especially exciting because it was the first year back after a three year hiatus due to the pandemic. The team from Outdoor Schools Washington shared the progress they've made since they passed their state funding. Learning about how they are setting up their system slightly different from the Oregon network was truly fascinating.

## **Supporting Outdoor School Nationwide**

Oregon was the first state in the country to create a statewide, fully-funded program to provide Outdoor School for All. Guess what? Other states took notice. State legislatures in Maine, Maryland, and Minnesota are considering bills to expand access to Outdoor School for all youth in their states. Efforts in Washington created Outdoor Schools Washington, which targets funds to help under-served youth across the state access Outdoor School. And efforts in Ohio, Tennessee and California are also underway.

One thing has become clear: Friends of Outdoor School (that's you!) has been critical in the success we are seeing in Oregon. Having your voices, your stories, and your support has made all the

difference in creating and sustaining a statewide Outdoor School program; one which remains true to the foundation of a transformative learning experience outdoors for every student while ensuring that each community can create the program that meets their unique needs.

While Friends of Outdoor School remains focused on supporting Oregon Outdoor School, we now participate in the national Outdoor School for All conversation. By sharing our journey, successes, and lessons learned, we hope that youth in all of these states can soon experience the joy of living and learning at Outdoor School.


